The Active School Travel
Programme is an exciting initiative
for schools who wish to see more
of their pupils choosing an active
and healthy journey to school. The
aim of the programme is to increase the number of pupils walking, cycling and scooting to school.

Sustrans is being funded by the Public Health Agency and the Department for Infrastructure to continue delivering the Active School Travel Programme across Northern Ireland until 2021.

Sustrans has been delivering this successful programme for the past three years. In 2017-18 within participating schools, there number of pupils travelling actively increased from 34% to 44%.

There were lots of introductory assemblies where pupils helped me to waken up my sleepy fold up bicycle 'Buzz Five Gears' and this was a great chance to engage with pupils for the first time about the super reasons we should be walking, cycling or scooting to school as much as possible.

Ditch The Dark days were delivered by many school champions and as these got closer to Christmas it was very evident that Christmas trees were being raided for tinsel and lights to dress pupils as brightly as possible on their journey to school.

Bicycle games, ditch the stabilisers sessions and plenty of classroom lessons made the autumn term very full and enjoyable.

Well done to Mr. Brown's class who were the December trophy winners!





Journey To Santa

Journey To Santa is an annual stamp sheet challenge that I run in the run up to the Christmas holidays from the middle of November to the middle of December.



This is a whole school individual challenge designed to encourage active travel when the weather turns a little bit grey and cold in the early winter months.

Each pupil gets a stamp sheet with Santa on his journey.

They get their sheet stamped on each morning that they walk, cycle or scoot to school and when they have filled up their stamp sheet it goes into a draw in the school and then into the overall prize draw.

This challenge gives pupils the encouragement to keep going as the year draws to a close and the incentive of a reward at the end really helps.



This year I offered some £50 bike shop vouchers as the incentive and the three prize winners were:

- 1. Pupil at Millington Primary in Portadown.
- 2. Pupil at St.Mary's Primary in Banbridge.
- 3. Pupil at Dickson Primary in Lurgan.

A B C D Bike Checks

One very important skill that we teach pupils in our schools is the ABCD bicycle check.

This simple check should be carried out quickly each time someone goes out for a ride.

A IS FOR AIR—is there enough air in my tyres?

B IS FOR BRAKES—do both of my brakes work well?

C IS FOR CHAIN—is my chain turning easily and a healthy colour with nothing sticking out of it?

D is for **DROP**— make sure nothing falls off my bike.

Get Ready for Big Pedal 2019



Sustrans <u>Big Pedal</u> is the UK's largest inter-school walking, cycling and scooting challenge that inspires pupils, staff and parents to choose two wheels or two feet for their journey to school.

The Big Pedal will run for 10 days from 25 March to 5 April 2019. On each day, schools compete to see who can get as many of their pupils, staff and parents walking, cycling or scooting to school. Your school's best five days will determine your final position, but you can log journeys on all ten days if you wish. There are fantastic prizes up for grabs each day of the challenge ranging from stunt shows to free scooters!



Registration for the Big Pedal 2019 will open in January 2019 with the launch of the new Big Pedal website. The Big Pedal has been going from strength to strength for nine years now and we are aiming to make Sustrans Big Pedal 2019 the best year yet. For the first time, walking will be counted alongside cycling and scooting so this opens up the leader board; it will be all to play for!
